Museum of Contemporary Art (15\$ entry) - .3 miles from the Drake. 6-minute walk.

The Museum of Contemporary Art Chicago is a contemporary art museum near Water Tower Place in downtown Chicago in Cook County, Illinois, United States. The museum, which was established in 1967, is one of the world's largest contemporary art venues.

<u>Chicago History Museum (17-19\$ entry)</u>- 1.1 miles from the Drake. 23-minute walk.

Lincoln Park at 1601 North Clark Street at the intersection of North Avenue. Fri & Sat 9:30am- 4:30 pm

Chicago History Museum is the museum of the Chicago Historical Society. The CHS was founded in 1856 to study and interpret Chicago's history. The museum has been located in Lincoln Park since the 1930s.

<u>Lincoln Park/Lincoln Park Zoo</u>-1.2 miles from the Drake. 25-minute walk.

Lincoln Park is a 1,208-acre park along Lake Michigan on the North Side of Chicago, Illinois. It is the city's largest public park and stretches for seven miles on the lakefront. Lincoln Park zoo is located within the park, a 30-minute walk from the Drake.

<u>Millennium/ Maggie Daley Park/ Grant Park</u>-1.3 miles from the Drake. 30-minute walk. 201 E Randolph St, Chicago, IL 60602

Millennium Park is a public park located in the Loop community area of Chicago, operated by the Chicago Department of Cultural Affairs. The park, opened in 2004 and intended to celebrate the third millennium, is a prominent civic center near the city's Lake Michigan shoreline that covers a 24.5-acre (9.9 ha) section of northwestern Grant Park. Featuring a variety of public art, outdoor spaces and venues, the park is bounded by Michigan Avenue, Randolph Street, Columbus Drive and East Monroe Drive.

Art Institute of Chicago (14-32\$ entry)- 1.5 miles from the Drake. 31-minute walk.

The Art Institute of Chicago in Chicago's Grant Park, founded in 1879, is one of the oldest and largest art museums in the world. Recognized for its curatorial efforts and popularity among visitors, the museum hosts approximately 1.5 million people annually. Its permanent collection of nearly 300,000 works of art is augmented by more than 30 special exhibitions mounted yearly that illuminate aspects of the collection and present cutting-edge curatorial and scientific research.

Field Museum (18-30\$ entry)- 3.1 miles from the Drake.
